

PRESS RELEASE: MAIN STREET RESURFACING PROJECT

Harrisburg, PA – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) this week began preparatory work on a project to repair and resurface a 4.52-mile section of U.S. 422 in Lebanon County from the intersection with Clear Spring Road at the North Annville-South Annville township line, through Annville Township and Cleona Borough to the intersection with 25th Street at the North Lebanon-North Cornwall township line.

The \$3,719,383.83 contract was awarded on February 16 to Pennsy Supply, Inc., of Annville, Lebanon County, and includes curb cut work required by the Americans with Disabilities Act, roadway base repair, full-width milling of the existing roadway and replacement with a three-inch bituminous overlay, guiderail backup and upgrades, and new signs and pavement markings. Work under this construction contract is scheduled to be completed by mid-November.

PennDOT advises travelers that initially they may encounter shifting traffic patterns and lane restrictions with flaggers directing traffic through intersections on weekdays between 8:30 AM and 3:30 PM as crews prepare the roadway for nighttime milling and resurfacing operations later this summer.

Some sections of U.S. 422 average more than 17,400 vehicles traveled daily. To avoid delays, travelers should allow for additional time in their plans or seek an alternate route.

Motorists are reminded to be alert for these operations, to obey work zone signs, and to slow down when approaching and traveling through work zones, not only for their safety, but for the safety of the road crews.
