WHAT IS CERT?

A Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is a group of volunteers that work to prepare, respond, and recover from disasters and emergencies in a local community. Across the United States, CERTs assist an organization with emergency and non-emergency functions, such as shelter management or light search and rescue operations. These volunteers are involved in local disaster management and help make their community more prepared.

In Lebanon County, CERT will assist the Department of Emergency Services (DES) with a variety of functions including damage assessments for severe weather and mass care facility management. Volunteers will also be involved in community engagement by participating in events across the county with DES members.

The goal of the Lebanon County CERT is to involve the local community in DES' mission to prepare, respond, and recover from disasters and emergencies.
