

**MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING
OF THE ANNVILLE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
November 7, 2018**

A Public Hearing was held by the Annville Township Board of Commissioners starting at 6:45 PM on November 7, 2018 in the Commissioners' Room of Annville Town Hall, 36 North Lancaster Street, Annville, PA to hear public comment on the proposed 2019 budget.


The following members were present: Rex A. Moore, President; Henri B. Lively, Vice President; Thomas R. Embich, Treasurer; Joann F. Zimmerman; and Nevin R. Hoover. Also in attendance were Nicholas T. Yingst, Township Administrator and Secretary to the Board of Commissioners; Bernard Dugan, Chief of Police; Corey Lamoureux, Esq., Township Solicitor; Ronald Dowey, Union Hose Company; Armin Rudd and Sarah Rudd, Maple Street; Dean Wolfe, West Main Street; Scott Mehok, Eckert Seamans; and Daryl Peck, Concord Public Finance.


President Moore called the Public Hearing to order and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

Julia DyReyes, Maple Street, joined the meeting at 6:46 PM.

Mr. Yingst reported the hearing was properly advertised and the proposed 2019 budget had been available for review in the Township Office and on the Township website since October 18, 2018. He also noted that comments were received from Mr. Rudd via email which had been provided to the Board. President Moore then asked for any comments or questions from those in attendance. Mr. Dowey questioned whether the General Fund expenditure of "Donation - Firemen's Relief Association" should be described as a donation because it represented funds passed from the State to municipalities that were required to be disbursed to a firemen's relief association. It was noted the Township could indicate to which relief association it wished to pass these monies, and it was further noted this expenditure was offset by revenue included as part of the "Intergovernmental Revenues" account. Should anyone reviewing the budget be confused by the nature of this, Mr. Yingst indicated he would be happy to clarify this with them.

With no further comments or questions noted, President Moore asked for a motion to close the Public Hearing. **MOTION** by Mr. Lively, second by Mr. Hoover to close the Public Hearing. Motion carried unanimously and the hearing was declared closed at 6:51 PM.
