Lebanon County— Residents and businesses of Lebanon County that were affected by the 7/21/18 to 7/27/18 flooding are invited to attend a workshop being conducted jointly by the Lebanon County Department of Emergency Services (LCDES) and the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) Central Area Office to report any damages related to the flooding event. If enough damages are reported, the victims of this flooding could possibly qualify for low-interest loans from the Small Business Administration (SBA) to assist in restoring property and homes to a livable condition.

Lebanon County officials are asking anyone affected by the 7/21/18 to 7/27/18 flooding to go to Lebanon County Municipal Building Auditorium Rm 10, 400 South 8th Street Lebanon PA 17042 for a SBA Workshop between 10AM and 5PM Friday 8/10/18 to meet with officials as part of the county's effort to qualify for an SBA Disaster Declaration. In order for the Commonwealth to request an SBA Disaster Declaration, a minimum of 25 homeowners, renters, and/or businesses with little or no insurance to cover the damages is needed to qualify.
